



Removal of body spillages (carpet) How to Guide

General information

All body spillages must be considered as contaminated or as a potential infection risk.

Oxivir Plus is effective against bacteria, spores, yeasts/moulds, and viruses including Hepatitis C, MRSA and Norovirus. Oxivir Plus should not be mixed with other cleaning chemicals, especially chlorine based products.

Please note: Always test carpets and soft furnishings for colour fastness in an inconspicuous area before applying chemical.

Put on disposable gloves, mask, goggles and apron. Put out 'cleaning in progress' sign/isolate the area.



NB: Report all body spillages and follow internal procedures for the cleaning of removal items such as linen and curtains.

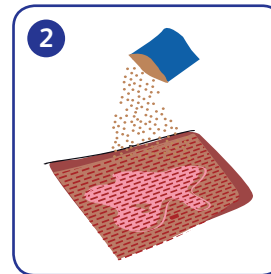

Application...



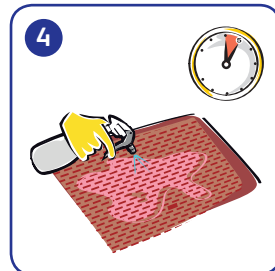
Spray Oxivir plus onto the affected area and 1 m vicinity including any items/furniture. Allow 5 minute contact time.



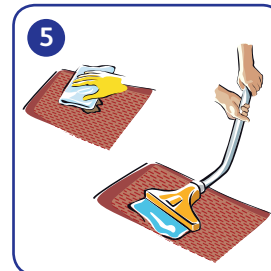
Sprinkle sachet of absorbent granules onto spillage and allow granules to soak up spillage.



Use scoop to scoop up granules and place inside waste bag.



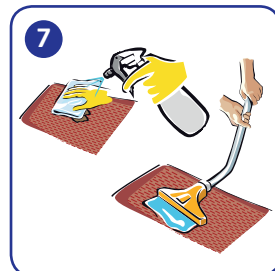
Repeat step 1, but ensure deep saturation of solution, and 5 minutes contact time



Blot dry area with absorbent paper towel or use an upholstery tool of an extraction cleaner.



Deposit all soiled material and protective equipment as contaminated waste.



Clean carpet with a suitable spot and stain cleaner or use a carpet extraction machine.



Leave to air dry, and keep area free from foot traffic.



Wash hands thoroughly for at least 20 seconds using a bactericidal hand soap.
